

How to Join Fletcher's Chapel Church:

Persons may become members of The United Methodist Church by:

- ◆ Profession of faith: A first-time commitment to Christ through the sacrament of baptism
- ♦ Reaffirmation of faith: A reaffirmation of your commitment to Christ
- ◆ Transfer of membership from another Methodist church
- ◆ Transfer of membership from another denomination

Baptism:

The Sacrament of Baptism is a requirement to join the United Methodist Church. If you have ever been baptized in any Christian church, that baptism is acceptable and there is no need to be re-baptized.

Profession of faith includes:

- ♦ Affirming your baptismal vows;
- ♦ Commitment to Jesus Christ as Lord;
- ◆ Accepting the Old and New Testaments as normative for faith and practice; and
- ♦ Commitment to live the Christian life and remain a faithful member of Christ's Holy Church through your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service, and your witness.
